Reading Matthew 10 vs 24-39

24."Students are not greater than their teacher, and slaves are not greater than their master.

Students are to be like their teacher; and slaves are to be like their master. And since I, the master of the household have been called the prince of demons, the members of my household will be called by even worse names. But don't be afraid of those who threaten you.

For the time is coming when everything that is covered will be revealed, and all that is secret

will be made known to all.

What I tell you now in the darkness, shout abroad when daybreak comes.

What I whisper in your ear, shout from the housetops for all to hear.

Don't be afraid of those who want to kill your body, they cannot touch your soul. Fear only God who can destroy both soul and body in hell.

But not a single sparrow can fall to the ground without your Father knowing it And the very hairs on your head are all numbered.

"When the going gets tough, the tough get going".

This is a modern saying, suggesting that challenging situations can inspire us to respond with strength and new resolve.

I guess we have all been challenged in some way in our lives, that we can recall. And these challenges can be costly can't they?

"Keep on going".

"Hang in there">

Practice makes perfect".

You can do it".

I have certainly had all of these words said to me on many many occasions!. Some things I mastered, some I didn't.

We are considering today, the challenging realities of being a disciple of Jesus. What it costs to be a disciple.

The reading from Matthew's gospel is one appointed from today's lectionary. We join it mid way through chapter 10.

Jesus continues to instruct his twelve disciples as he sends them out, to embark on their mission to the towns around the region.

It's good to remember that as modern day disciples in 2020, these instructions are for us as well.

This collection of sayings of Jesus included by Matthew contain some difficult words. The first section reminds the disciples that their task is to be like their teacher and master, Jesus.himself.

Their mission is his mission, and their lives are to assume the character of Jesus' own life,

Speaking to others what they have heard from Jesus.

The second section tells them not to be afraid.

Yes, they will face hostility and even violent opposition.

Jesus offers the reassurance that comes from knowing that the God who cares even for the sparrow,

the smallest and most insignificant bird, cares for them.

In the final section the true cost of discipleship is spelt out. Even those closest to us will not necessarily go along with us.

I wonder if some of the disciples at this stage, hearing Jesus describing the disturbing things that could happen

to them, were thinking that they would very much like to change their minds , and wondering how soon it would

be appropriate to make their resignation speech!!

Yes, choosing to serve Jesus and do the work of his kingdom changes us.

The complete break with previous held commitments and priorities ,that is required by Jesus; is summed

up in the image of carrying your own cross.v 38.

It is fitting that as Jesus sends out his disciples, his last instructions contain a challenge about the reality of following Him.

The picture of a man on his way to his crucifixion would have been a vivid image in the first century.

This is the first time in this Gospel that Jesus hints at the manner of his death, and it is just as real a challenge to us today,

as it was then.

Most of us will not be put in a position of having to choose whether we are willing to die for Christ.

But, if we are to take Jesus seriously, our own life's safety and comforts must take second place.

So, yes, there are challenging realities, which as disciples of Jesus we will face. Once we get involved with Jesus, life is never the same again. I'm sure you will agree with me, when I say that "The going has been tough over these last 3 months or so.

And I guess will continue to be tough in many different ways as we continue to come through the Covid 19 crisis.

The phone conversation which we heard Caroline making earlier was a response to Jesus' "advert" for new disciples.

This advert is realistic in that Jesus dosen't offer life without problems.

Rather, he promises to help us through the difficulties we will meet.

He will walk alongside us.

We are not immune to trouble and difficulties even at such times as we are in now. Unprecedented times. We have heard those words so many times haven't we?

Being obedient to God is never the easy option.

There is always a cost.

Therefore it is the grace of God which enables us to live faithful lives, to speak God's word and to endure hostility that may come our way.

Jesus has been there before us and His life and death create a pattern for believers, so his Resurrection offers us hope of transformation.

Alleluia,

God always has us in his care and keeps us close to Him..

May we all find new strength and new resolve as we serve Him in our world today Amen
