THOUGHT FOR TODAY: Waiting For God

After planting seeds in the greenhouse recently I remember looking to see, several times that day if they had germinated! Was this over-optimism, anxiety or impatience - whatever! I needed to patiently wait for the germination process to take place. I remember my mother saying, 'watch kettle never boils'. A frequent saying in my childhood days! So, I watered the seeds regularly, as prescribed, and now several weeks later they are ready to prick out and plant up. One of the benefits, in our current Covid-19 total-lock-down situation is that the garden is as tidy as it has been for years, so early in the season!

How are you waiting in this difficult time?

When sad news and negative reporting come at us from all angles, it is a natural reaction to feel anxious and afraid - but how should we as Christians respond?

For me, at times like this, I look for God's promises in His Word and try to focus on what he is saying to us.

Psalm 130 for example contains just eight verses, with words such as forgiveness, hope and unfailing love to remind us how much God loves us, - loves you.

Verse 5 reads, ⁵ I wait for the LORD, my soul waits, and in his word I put my hope. (NIVUK)

The Lord spoke powerfully to me through the word wait in that verse.

Waiting is something we generally find difficult to do.

As I pursued this thought I found the following text helpful and comforting:-

Isaiah 40:31, Yet those who wait for the LORD will gain new strength; They will mount up with wings like eagles, They will run and not get tired, They will walk and not become weary. (NASB)

The prophet Isaiah gave us this powerful promise.

It is a continual challenge to wait patiently on the Lord, The Lord will reward us for waiting upon him. We can remain calm when it appears that nothing is happening.

As we learn to respond to life in new ways, the winds of adversity will lift us up, like wind beneath the wings of an eagle, instead of knocking us down. As we develop a patient faith in God we will be able to wait on him to complete his work in our lives. We will be continually renewed through the Cross and Resurrection of Jesus and in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Perhaps the extra time given to us, because of the lockdown, is a further opportunity to spend more time in God's company through meditating, waiting, on His Word.

Proverbs 3:5-6 reads, 5 Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; 6 in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight. (NIVUK)
