## Thought for the day – Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> May

Last week, as we were tucking into our dinner of fish and chips, my husband commented that he really wished he could be eating fish and chips at the seaside.

Even though we don't live by the sea, we love having the opportunity to travel to the coast – I still get that childish excitement at the first glimpse of the sea like I'm seeing it for the first time.

This started me thinking about the unpredictability of the sea:

Often it can be calm and the gentle lapping of the water evokes peace and contentment.



Sometimes, it appears impatient as the tide rushes in and sends holiday makers running.



At other times, it is turbulent and tempestuous – waves crashing on rocks and threatening lives.



Our lives can often mirror the different 'moods' of the sea. There are times when everything seems calm and peaceful. We are happy in our jobs, we find time to enjoy our hobbies, family and friends. Some of us may have times of impatience and feel the need to rush to reach an end goal which can lead to not having enough time for others, and finally, there may be times when we feel in the middle of a dark and menacing storm where the waves threaten to overwhelm us. The current situation we are all living in at the moment may be one of those times and I am in no doubt that all of us are feeling unsettled, worried or frightened to some extent and are wondering when the storm will pass.

I am sure this was how the disciples felt when they faced a storm on Lake Galilee:

<sup>35</sup>On the evening of that same day Jesus said to his disciples, "Let us go across to the other side of the lake." <sup>36</sup>So they left the crowd; the disciples got into the boat in which Jesus was already sitting, and they took him with them. Other boats were there too. <sup>37</sup>Suddenly a strong wind blew up, and the waves began to spill over into the boat, so that it was about to fill with water. <sup>38</sup>Jesus was in the back of the boat, sleeping with his head on a pillow. The disciples woke him up and said, "Teacher, don't you care that we are about to die?"


