This I was reluctant to do for in some ways it was a simple repair yet beyond my capabilities. So when in conversation with just the right person I mentioned this quandary and was instantly rewarded with the words. I will do that or something similar.

The second was for a job my husband was wanting to do and we were wondering how and where he could acquire the correct size piece of wood required. A phone call from someone and I was promoted to ask if their husband might be able to help.

Within a couple of days I received a message to inform me that the repair was completed. As for the wood, it was delivered to our home within a very short time after the phone call.

There are so many different ways in which there has been support given and need met during recent months for all the members of our fellowship of believers. This to me answers the question with a resounding yes. I do believe we still carry the torch of those first believers. Sometimes in very different ways, sometimes in the same way, Our spoken testimony. As I say thank you for the items I have shared with you, I also know that there are many who are saying thank you for items received through the post and phone calls received, especially those without internet. Those of the fellowship who have internet access have had an abundance of material from many working to support the fellowship. So once again I say thank you all very much.
