Peter writes to give hope and encouragement to Christians who were suffering for the sake of Christ. Of coming out of the darkness into his wonderful light. Once rejected Christ is the cornerstone the one in whom we believe and place our trust.

The image in the first part of this passage is of a newborn baby seeking milk. This reminds me of what it is like when we first come to know Jesus as our Saviour. We are sometimes like a child, a babe needing to be nurtured to be supported with a hunger to learn more of Jesus. I remember feeling like this when I accepted Jesus into my life and being filled with great excitement and impatience, hungry to learn and to be spiritually fed.

The second image includes being chosen, being people of God. Working together building a community. One of the things that I have enjoyed throughout this time when we have been unable to worship in our church buildings is the coming together to worship from our homes with others around the circuit. A new way and yet one that began many years ago, when people gathered in each other's homes for worship. A feeling of being part of a wider community coming together. Throughout the year we sometimes gather together for a circuit service but now we are coming together for Sunday worship and daily. I feel truly blessed and thankful for this time of sharing with others. build our faith.

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Gospel reading John 14: 1-14

Jesus Comforts His Disciples

"Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in me. 2In my Father's house are many rooms; if it were not so, I would have told you. I am going there to prepare a place for you. 3And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am. 4you know the way to the place where I am going."

Jesus the Way to the Father

₅Thomas said to him, "Lord, we don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?" ₅Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No-one comes to the Father except through me. ¬If you really knew me, you would know my Father as well. From now on, you do know him and have seen him." ₅Philip said, "Lord, show us the Father and that will be enough for us."

⁹Jesus answered: "Don't you know me, Philip, even after I have been among you such a long time? Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? ¹⁰Don't you believe that I am in the Father, and that the Father is in me? The words I say to you are not just my own. Rather, it is the Father, living in me, who is doing his work. Believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; or at least believe on the evidence of the miracles themselves. ¹²I tell you the truth, anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing. He will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father. ¹³And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Son may bring glory to the Father. ¹⁴You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it.

Jesus said "In my Father's house there are many rooms," there is room for all who follow him. This is the Gospel of Christ, Praise to Christ our Lord.

In the second part of the reading Jesus is speaking to his disciples before his death. This passage from the Gospel of John begins with Jesus offering reassurance and comfort to his disciples. He had previously foretold of Peter's denial of him. The disciples were worried and upset by the thought of betrayal and the thought of Jesus leaving them. He calms their fears telling them he will come back. He will not abandon them. The teaching is in question and answer form with Thomas being honest enough to admit he did not understand what Jesus was saying. Thomas asks Jesus where he is going. Jesus then asks a question of Philip v9 "Don't you know me Philip." The disciples had travelled around the countryside with Jesus this is coming to an end. Here he is commissioning them for service, for the work they would continue after he has gone. The work as followers of Christ we continue today in his name.

In the past few weeks we have seen many thousands of people coming forward offering their services by volunteering to help others. Neighbours delivering food to people in isolation. Others making scrubs for front line medical staff. Sometimes what might seem like small things, taking in the bins for a neighbour after they have been emptied. Acts of kindness appreciated by the recipients.

The reassurance Jesus gives is particularly relevant for us today with what is happing in our world with many in need of comfort and reassurance.

Thomas asks v5 "Lord we don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?"

At present we are encouraged not to travel. Let us think back to times when we were planning a journey. How did we find the way to reach our destination? Often we plan our route with the aid of a map, we have technology to help us in the form of sat navs there are road signs to guide and direct us. That doesn't mean we don't get lost but we usually reach the place we set out for.

The passage ends with a promise, You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it. Pray in the name of Jesus.

Jesus calls us to believe, to come to Him he is the way to the Father.

On our walk of faith we sometimes talk the wrong route, we may stray from the path and lose our way. There is a way back. Turn to Jesus. He tells us I am the Way and the Truth and the Life.

Lord Jesus.

We follow you because we trust you;

you are the Way.

We follow you because we believe you;

you are the Truth.

We follow you because we cannot live without you;

you are the Life.

We worship you because trust, belief and the desire to live your life

brings us to your feet in adoration and praise.
